- Dr. Priyaka Khanna warmly welcomed all the members and proceeded to review the minutes of the previous IQAC meeting, which were subsequently confirmed by all attendees.
- It was unanimously agreed during the meeting to integrate the observance of specific national and international days of significance into the Academic Schedule for the academic year 2022-23. The importance of active community engagement by various departments, cells, and clubs in celebrating these days was emphasized. The college's Academic Calendar for the session 2022-23 was drafted to include these major activities.
- The admission process was thoroughly reviewed, and a plan was devised for its smooth execution. It was recommended that admission forms be meticulously scrutinized, and students informed promptly in case of any discrepancies.



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- A timetable committee was established to manage the workload of teachers effectively through careful planning. Heads of departments were advised to ensure that individual faculty members prepare prospective lesson plans and semester unitization for the odd semester.
- An induction program for first-year students was planned to familiarize them with the college's infrastructure, faculty, and regulations. Dr. Parminder Kaur (Head, Department of Computer Sciences) and Dr. Aditi (Head, Department of Psychology) were entrusted with organizing the program.
- In response to directives from the DPI Colleges to celebrate Independence Day under the theme "Har Ghar Tiranga" (Every Home, the Tricolor), the Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat (EBSB) Club was tasked with coordinating various activities in collaboration with NCC and NSS.
- The reconstitution of various committees and clubs responsible for college activities was discussed to provide new recruits with opportunities and exposure.
- The Coordinator proposed celebrating Teacher's Day by educating students about the birth anniversary of Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan, a renowned teacher and scholar, Bharat Ratna awardee, and the first Vice-President and second President of independent India. This initiative aimed to help students appreciate the efforts made by their teachers in providing them with quality education.
- The Teej festival, celebrated annually by the Punjabi department to welcome the new season, had its action plan put forth, including the issuance of duty lists for organizing the event. This festival aims to instill cultural awareness among students by acquainting them with their rich heritage.
- A meeting was convened as directed by the Director, Youth Welfare Department, Panjab University, to finalize the venue for the Zonal Youth and Heritage Festival (Ludhiana Zone-B).

- The Admission Committee was established and briefed on the entire admission process. Faculty members assigned to oversee admissions for various courses were informed about the date for displaying the provisional list of eligible applicants. Various avenues and strategies for enhancing publicity for admissions to Add-on and Vocational Courses were explored. Many present members proposed strengthening admissions through visits to various schools.
- The timetable was finalized by the committee, and department heads ensured that faculty prepared lesson plans and unitization.
- The Department of Political Science organized an event, "Jashn-e-Rekhta," on 8th August 2022, commemorating the sacrifices of freedom fighters and political visionaries.



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Additionally, the EBSB Club organized a webinar titled "Our National Flag" to deepen students' understanding and appreciation of the national flag as a symbol of unity and excellence, fostering a sense of responsibility towards the nation's progress. A "Selfie with Tiranga" contest was also held by the EBSB Club to promote patriotism, creativity, and community spirit among female students. Furthermore, an NCC flag hoisting ceremony celebrated India's 75th Independence Day on 15th August 2022 at the Ludhiana group level.

- The Department of Punjabi organized the Teej festival on 17th August 2022 with the participation of the entire college community.
- Various celebrations including Teachers' Day, International Youth Day, Partition Horrors Remembrance Day, and International Charity Day were organized by relevant departments, clubs, and cells.
- Orientations for ongoing classes and an Induction Program for new entrants were scheduled for the month of September.
- A meeting of directors and principals of the Ludhiana-B zone was held on 12th August 2022 in the Principal's office to discuss the Zonal Youth and Heritage Festival. The dates and venue for the festival were finalized: 15th October to 19th October at Ramgarhia Girls College, Ludhiana.

- The Coordinator presented and confirmed the minutes of the IQAC meeting held on 01 August 2022.
- Discussions were held regarding the organization of a 'Talent Hunt Program' to select participants for the upcoming Youth Festival. Specific responsibilities were assigned to various faculty members to guide and select students for different program segments. The Department of Fine Arts and Music took the initiative to coordinate this event in the near future.
- Dr. Iqbal Kaur (Principal) emphasized that all Heads of Departments, along with their faculty members, should actively encourage maximum student participation in the Youth



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Festival events. Duty assignments for item Incharges were discussed and issued to ensure proper coordination and execution of respective festival items.

- Various activities were suggested by department heads to enhance the course curriculum.
  Consequently, department heads were instructed to organize these activities under different
  categories such as extension lectures, webinars, visits, and workshops. Following the
  completion of each activity, reports are to be submitted to the Activity Record Committee
  for assessment.
- As per discussion with the Principal and registrar the dates for the MST-I was decided and it was directed to the registrar office that the notices regarding the lecture shortage, assessment etc and duty list for the conduct of examination circulated in time.
- During September and October, several days and weeks of national importance and remembrance are scheduled. Departments associated with these commemorative occasions were tasked with organizing suitable celebrations.
- In response to post-COVID health concerns, the college is prioritizing health awareness initiatives. Concerned departments like Zoology, along with interested clubs and cells, are expected to collaborate on health awareness projects and submit comprehensive reports.
- The annual NCC anniversary celebration plans were briefed to Dr. Parminder (NCC officer) for implementation.
- The Diwali celebration plan, termed 'Diwali Bonanza,' was assigned to the Department of Fine Arts.
- Additionally, discussions with the Registrar were held to finalize the October Mid-Semester Test (MST) dates. Various notices, including those regarding shortages and duty assignments, were issued to ensure the smooth conduct of house tests.

- A Talent Hunt Competition was organized by the Fine Arts Department on 25th September 2021 to identify hidden talents among the college students.
- A duty list for the Youth Festival was prepared and signed by the faculty on duty.
  Departmental-level competitions such as quiz, debate, declamation, and essay writing were
  conducted to enhance students' reading, writing, and speaking skills, and to build
  confidence, poise, and self-esteem among them. Practice sessions were initiated by all item
  incharges at the designated Youth Festival venues.
- The dates for the MST-I was decided (27/10/22 to 07/11/22) and the duty list for invigilation was circulated among faculty. The notice for lecture shortage and assessment was also circulated for timely update the record of data registers in the registrar office.



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• All departments were actively engaged in planning and organizing extension activities under the guidance of IQAC:

**Extension Lectures:** The Department of Commerce, Psychology, and Punjabi organized extension lectures related to their curriculum on 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> September respectively. Additionally, a webinar on Cyber Security was conducted for students by the Computer Science Department.

**Visits:** An industrial visit by the Department of Chemistry (21/09/22), an experiential visit to a Radio Station by the Department of English, and an educational visit to the Central Research Institute, Kasauli by the Department of Biotechnology (30/09/2022) were organized in September.

**Workshops:** Workshops on makeup, hairstyle basics, and mehndi art by the Beauty Wellness Department (30/9/22), resume writing by the Commerce Department (28/9/22), and "Unlocking the Potential of Digital Technologies: Career Opportunities Ahead" by the Computer Science Department (19/10/2022) were conducted.

- The Student Council organized community service activities such as awareness programs and donations.
- Various national days were celebrated including International Day of Charity (5/09/22), World Peace Day (21/9/22), Birth anniversary of Sardar Bhagat Singh Ji (28/9/22), Lata Ji's Birthday (1/10/22), International Day of Non-Violence (2/10/22), and National Unity Day (31/10/22) by the Rotaract Club, NSS, Sociology, History, Music, and History departments respectively. The Computer Department also observed E-Waste Awareness Week with activities aimed at raising awareness about electronic waste. The Department of Zoology celebrated National Wildlife Week to raise awareness about the importance of wildlife. Similarly, the Physics Department celebrated World Space Week.
- Health-related issues were addressed through activities such as a blood donation drive and awareness campaigns on Mental Health Day (10/09/2022), Dengue Awareness (13/09/22), AIDS Awareness (21/09/22), and Dyslexia Awareness (21/10/22) organized by various departments and clubs including NSS, Youth Red Cross, Counselling Cell, and Zoology Department.
- Diwali Bonanza (Exhibition-cum-Sales) was organized by the Department of Fine Arts on 20/10/22 featuring 86 stalls selling various items. Special stalls showcasing Diwali items by self-help groups and the gardening club were highlighted.



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• Mid-Semester Tests (MST) were conducted smoothly in October and marks along with any shortages were uploaded to the registrar's data registers.

- IQAC coordinator appreciated the work done by all criterion convenors and it was proposed that each convenor shall devise an action plan based on recommendations made by peer team in their respective criterion. Convenor of the first criterion proposed



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along the we need to start with more skill development courses, based on feedback given by 90 percent of students, and criterion 3 convenors proposed to strengthen entrepreneurial and research parameters.

- The overall results of the Annual University Examination for the academic year 2020-21 were discussed during a meeting led by the IQAC Coordinator. Students and staff were acknowledged and appreciated for their achievements that brought honor to the campus. Our students excelled and secured positions in the Panjab University merit list for both undergraduate (UG) and postgraduate (PG) courses. The IQAC Coordinator and Co-coordinator presented the examination results to the attendees during the session.
- The results of Zonal Youth Festival were also appreciated by everyone. And it was directed to the coordinator of youth festival Dr. Kamaljit Grewal, to plan for the interzonal youth festival for the winner items dates for which is going to be held from 10th To 13th, November, 2022 At Swami Premanand Mahavidyalya, Mukerian.
- It was suggested to the computer department to organize few extension activities related to the computer education.
- End Semester Examination dates were from 28<sup>th</sup> November to 31<sup>st</sup> December so the proper plan of action was asked during the meeting.
- Recognizing the growing importance of skills departments were directed to organize workshops. The English Department advised organizing a session demonstrating their hands on experience with the radio anchor.
- As per DPI Colleges the month of November should be celebrated as "Punjabi Mahina" so the department of Punjabi was directed to organize various activities.
- Celebration of Birth Anniversary of Bhagwan Birsa Munda as Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas and Tribute to Kartar Singh Sarabha on his Martyrdom Day for these days department of history took the initiatives.
- The National constitution day was decided to be celebrated so departments were asked to plan and execute activities accordingly. Department of Mathematics planned to celebrate the National mathematics day by visiting school.
- Social awareness is an essential skill for college and job preparation since it aids in student growth, allowing them to become a better person or colleague. The members, therefore, agreed to plan activities/talks/visits for the students in order to sensitize them about the societal issues and concerns and the ways they can adopt to solve the same.
- To start a new chapter of health and fitness with enthusiasm and dedication physical education department opened a gymnesium in the college campus so the inauguration



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programme for the same was discussed.

  - Extension activities by computer department:

- A workshop on "3D Modelling and Animation for Product Visualization" conducted on 04/11/22
- On 7/11/2022 a workshop related to the career opportunities in Phython Programming was also organized.

- It was discussed in the meeting that college signed MOUs. In order to give the students practical information and educate them about industrial aspects, the members decided to conduct workshops and seminars for them by professionals in the field in subsequent months.
- With the discussion with all members it was decided to start few short term courses and the department of commerce and computer science agreed to conduct related to computer language.
- The days for the celebration was discussed and finally following were decided to celebrate : Global family day, National youth day, Lohri festival celebrations, army day, parakram Diwas, National Girl Child day and National Science day. The department heads were
